Cash cannot be used for everyday transactions.

Cash can be used to pay for a transaction up to the limit.

Europe's cash restrictions are already as low as \$1000 euros. When's our turn?

Exemptions for personal transactions are not written into the law itself. They are in a separate regulation (a legislative instrument)- the Minister can change them at any time!

Private individuals cannot buy or sell sale of second-hand goods between private individuals.

Provide are required to store money in the bank.

People are required to store money with draw as him or more cash outside of a bank or withdraw as him on their bank account.

You will still be able to deposit or withdraw as him on their bank account.

You will still be able to deposit and withdraw 100.000 or more cash into and from your accounts.

The Government can amend the Bill of the cash limit without scrutiny by the Senate.
